

Keep your clients safe

We often talk about how to keep you and your crew safe, but it's worth sparing a thought for your clients too. When you're on site at someone's home are there any improvements you can suggest to them that will help them improve the safety of their home? After all, if you're already on site, a bit of washing here or a few coats of Resene Non-Skid Deck

and Path are a lot more cost effective than a broken hip if someone falls over on slippery paths or stairs. These suggestions are especially relevant when you are working with elderly clients or those with small children who are more likely to suffer falls.

More injuries happen at home than at work, on the road, or while playing sport. In fact, on average, someone is injured at home every 48 seconds! But it's not all doom and gloom. The good news is, with just a few simple changes, homes can be made safer.

Some top tips from ACC that Resene can help with are:

Keep paths and steps clear of leaves and moss and be careful when it's raining. You can clean moss and mould with Resene Moss & Mould Killer, decks with Resene Timber and Deck Wash and paths with Resene Deep Clean or Resene Paint Prep and Housewash.

- Make sure outdoor areas are well lit with sensor lights and mark the edges of steps and drops with white paint for better visibility. Try using Resene Non-Skid Deck and Path for this so the white strip of paint has the added benefit of being non slip.
- If you're building from new, grooved timber on decks gives better grip. If you have an existing deck you can improve its slip resistance by adding Resene SRG Grit to your deck paint to reduce the risk of slips.
 - Keep chemical, solvents, paints and sprays out of sight and reach of children – ideally lock them away in a cupboard. Better yet, return all unwanted paint and paint packaging to the Resene PaintWise **service** – it will get them out of the house and the packaging and materials can be recycled, donated to community groups or reused.
 - Keep three points of contact on ladders e.g. two feet and a hand. Don't reach over too far - keep your belt buckle within the sides of the ladder.

Knot what???

Here's one from Pete Turner that we think you'll like...

"Whilst working back home (UK), the gaffer took on an apprentice. After about a month of doing nothing but sanding for the lads, the apprentice asks the gaffer if he can progress in his apprenticeship and learn to paint. The timber back home is full of knots, and so has to be 'Knotted', prior to being primed using 'Knotting' (which is a shellac based sealer) in order to prevent weeping of the sap from the knots.

So the gaffer points out a pile of architraves on the floor (about 50 x3 metre lengths) and says to the 'lad', "ok son see all that timber, prime that lot and Knot the knots". After doing his rounds the gaffer is about to leave and on the way out reminds the lad, "Don't forget knot the knots when you prime".

The following day the gaffer shows up and sees all the timber nicely laid out on the floor all primed with exception to all the knots in the wood. Off goes the gaffer at the lad, "what the \$%@# is that?" To which the lad says, "you said don't forget when I prime not the knots." Ten o'clock break was always a riot after that day."
